Game Lengths

- All games will be three, 15-minute stop time periods.
- Overtime will be a single, 5-minute run time, sudden-death for all games, except for the Championship Round games.
- Overtime in the Championship Round game will be a 5-minute sudden-death period, followed by a 3-person shootout with 1-person continuation till there is a winner.
- Ice will be resurfaced after 2 periods. Example: warm up, 1st, 2nd, resurface, 3rd, warm up, 1st, resurface.

Running Clock

If a team is ahead by 5 goals or more at any point of the game, the clock will be run time unless the goal differential is reduced to 3 goals.

Timeouts

Each team will receive ONLY one timeout per game. There will be no additional timeouts given for overtime play.

Scoring & Standings

There will be two division. They will play a round robin. Based on points, the top team from each division will play in the Championship game. If there is a tie in points at the end of the round robin, the top team will be selected by 1) Head-to-Head, 2) Least number of goals allowed, 3) head-to-head record in regular season, 4) Least number of penalty minutes in first 3 games 5) coin flip.

The Tournament Scoreboard will be located in the South Rink Lobby. Official game scores and points will be posted in a timely matter, and they will also be tweeted @OzaukeeIce.

Suspensions and Expulsions

The WEHL and Ozaukee Ice Center reserve the right to suspend and/or remove any player, parent, coach, or spectator who displays unsportsmanlike, disruptive, or vulgar behavior that is deemed by the Tournament Director or Rink Officials as detrimental to the best interest of the tournament and youth hockey.

Game Officials

Home Team will be responsible to have four volunteers each game to run the scoreclock (1), fill out the scoresheet (1), and man each penalty box (2). A scoresheet will need to be filled in by each team prior to the start of warm ups.



Game Officials (cont)

Each team should get a scoresheet at the end of the game. One copy of the scoresheet needs to be left in the scorer's box for a tournament rep to pick up and fill out the tournament score board. *Please coordinate with referees on who will be moving the nets during resurfaces.*

Championship Game Tie Breaker

1. Head to Head
2. Least number of goals allowed
3. Head to Head regular season (WEHL vs WEHL)
4. Least number of penalty minutes
5. Coin Flip
